GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- You must comply with the instructions of the wardens at all times.
- You should not pick up any objects found on the range.
- It is regretted that camping or fires are not allowed.
- Please do not enter any building.
- Please protect the wildlife. Do not collect specimens of flowers, birds, eggs, insects or fossils without permission.

For safety's sake please do not leave the paths and do not touch any ammunition you may see.

WARNING

All visitors to Lulworth Ranges must take heed that this is an Army Range and the public have no right of access when firing is taking place. Visitors must keep within the Way Marks on each path. If people stray away from the clearly visible path Way Marks they can endanger themselves and others because only the designated paths have been cleared of explosives. Paths are marked on both sides by plain wooden posts with yellow bands. They are placed at about 80 to 100 metre intervals and are clearly visible. In addition the boundaries of the coastal path from Gold Down to Worbarrow Bay and from Flower's Barrow to Ash Mill to Blodion Hill are marked by a fence and yellow topped posts.
